

# Knights of the Round Table

The Scepter Eludes Blue Knights in Gatlinburg

The 10<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Knights of the Round Table Motorcycle Tournament<sup>®</sup> was hosted by the Red Knights this year in the Great Smoky Mountains of East Tennessee. It was great gathering of men and women from three of the professions we most admire: Law Enforcement, Firefighters and the Military...Blue Knights<sup>®</sup> International Motorcycle Club, Red Knights<sup>™</sup> International Military Motorcycle Club respectively.

With this being the tenth anniversary of the first contest between these three groups of motorcycle riders, The Knights of the Round Table has expanded. In 2014, the event was duplicated in Germany, welcoming Western Europe, and in 2015, Australia. It is nothing but great fun and competition in order to have the win the champion's Scepter, to hold on to (along with bragging rights) until the following year's competition.


Our Blue Knights team did well, but not enough to overtake the final tally of the Red Knights; the domination over the last six years by the Green Knights was finally broken. The Blue Knights team competed hard; Randy and Robin West, Fl.V, took First Place in the Motorcycle Lance event and Kenny Craig, Pa.II, took First Place in the Motorcycle Agility course

The 2019 event will be hosted by the Blue Knights® according to the rotation of hosting clubs. The date will be on or near October 10-13, 2019, and the location was hoped to return to Florida, but an opportunity arose that must be explored first, so location has not been set as of yet.

Founder Alex Ramirez stated, "It started in 2009 by Blue Knights® Florida IV, Miami. This motorcycle tournament is a turkey shoot that anybody can win. The winning driver is titled the, "BEST RIDER" of 2019 and takes home the Scepter, a custom made wall hung device bearing the three club logos in full color with mounting plates identifying the past years' winners and club. The award is presented to the winner's club and for wall display in a place of honor, such as a Chief or top Executive's office, for the next twelve months, or next Knights of the Round Table Tournament. The winning club also hosts the next KRT at the location of their choice."

Alex continued, "The events are not money makers, with a small kitty forwarded year to year, and of course groups are asked to donate a bottle to limit expenses, bantering and laughter remain free, and every year brings new surprises from each club. Each club assembles a team of five for the Blacksmith's Challenge, and another five muscle men if the Firefighters show up with fire truck, or maybe the military will finally deliver a tank for the Pull competition. I hope the local SWAT team can back up the Blue Knights® if we have to sing, I'm a little Tea Pot, again. In addition to the Grand Prize Scepter, first, second and third place awards are being awarded to runner-ups."

# Rome, Italy Host City of the 2018 European Conference

At the end of 2016, Kurt Petri, honorary member of Germany V, came up with the idea to do something. Something daring and slightly crazy. Kurt planned to make a trip at the tender age of 74 together with his more than 60 years old Zündapp team. It should take place in 2017 and lead through no less than 17 countries in Europe and any proceeds from donations should benefit a good cause. So easy. Either clockwise or counterclockwise. Or zigzag, but this alternative quickly closed. So it finally went clockwise through Europe.

The next step was to find a chapter in each country that Kurt could visit on his way. After long weeks of planning, email traffic, the search for sponsors and the technical preparation, it was time. Many companies donated material and what Kurt did not need, he sold and increased the amount of the donation. Of course, a patch and a sticker were not missing. Incidentally, remaining stock can still be purchased.

Kurt was ready to leave, but not without the then Cologne police chief, Mr. Jürgen Matthies, to win as patron. No sooner said than done, in the convoy it was time for the first stage. Well, I could of course now minutely down every day and every stage driven, but that would be both too long and not my intention. If Kurt ever writes his memoirs, you can certainly read a more comprehensive summary.

I would like to describe special encounters with Blue Knights and others, without the meetings with Mo Caderas, who picked up Kurt in the middle of an Alpine pass, the wonderful meal with Italy II, the visit of Webs in Freiburg, the unexpected free night in Luxembourg, Netherlands II, belittling the long waited for long at the border and the welcome by Belgium XXII in Bastogne and the considerable attendance by Germany XVI and XXII on its last stage. Thank you very much for the great support.

But let's start here with Kurt's entrance into Prague. In retrospect, it was good that his GPS had stopped working for a while, because it was precisely this break that aroused the curiosity of a tour guide who saw this man standing in front of the bus in his green motorcycle with a sidecar. She asked him if she could take a picture. Charmingly, Kurt negated the question and explained just as charmingly that a photo would cost at least the purchase of a patch. Of course, he had to explain exactly, and the tour guide decided to return to the bus. Then come back to the inmates, all



women in Kurt's age. Each bought a patch and the picture was taken.

Party in Croatia or how Kurt almost stranded there. Exactly that what many Blue Knight has already happened there. Croatia I decided not only to show Kurt the tomb of Davor Javorski, the legendary first president and founder of the Croatian Blue Knights, no, they

not only organized a small exit, but afterwards a party with many guests. Kurt told me afterwards that this was the most strenuous thing he ever had. But the hospitality in Croatia made him forget the hardships and it remained a priceless memory. Lucky for him that the Croats provided for his onward journey, otherwise he would probably still be there, and his wife would have had to

The visit to our south-easternmost chapter in Europe was another highlight not only for Kurt alone. Bosnia-Herzegovina is very remote in the European Conference. It took a good planning, the way through this beautiful country, Kurt raved about it. The meeting with the chapter there is a little tricky, because he had to wait until 10:00 pm, but when it happened, it became another unforgettable memory.

Finally, I would like to tell the story in Switzerland. There, Kurt met a few elderly men in the restaurant of his hotel, one of whom asked because of the Cologne plate, whether the cathedral still







stands. By the way, yes, Kurt really spoke of older men. The conversation started, and the men were listening intently to Kurt's story, and the five Germans and a Scot whom the rest respectfully called Sir. After the farewell Kurt knew only that

the men had probably served in the Air Force and were on the NATO base in Geilenkirchen. They met once a year, always in a different place. Well, at the reception desk, Kurt learned that not only his food, but also his room had been paid, and the men had left an envelope. Nobody knew who the men were or where they lived. Due to the quite extensive preparations after so many kilometers, he forgot to open the envelope. All the bigger was the surprise when 600 € and 100 Scottish pounds fell from the envelope at home. Even when writing, I get the same goose bumps that I had when I heard this story for the first time. This tour showed not only the incredible spirit of the Blue Knights, but also the fantastic reactions of strangers to his story.

Finally, we were able to hand over a check of over € 13,000 to a charitable organization in Cologne.

This organization provides a home for the parents of children with cancer in which they live while the children are being treated.

I only have one word for that: GREAT!

Actually, that would be it. But wait, where does the candle come from? She's from Vienna. After the auction of five cigars and a bottle of rum, Claudia Lindemann-Stoffler contacted me and offered me a candle with Blue Knights coat of arms for the auction, which your mother had made by hand.Immediately I thought of using this candle for a different purpose. A candle would be a much better symbol for all Knights in Heaven I in a church. And what would be better than the Cologne Cathedral? Only the Peters Cathedral in Rome, but since Kurt belongs to Germany V, the candle stays in Cologne. After many conversations with the cathedral chapter, we got the permission to set up and light the candle during the European Convention 2019. And who will that be? Of course, Claudia from Austria I and Kurt from Germany V.



#### **IL 13 member, Artez Hardin** International Meritorious Service Award

uring the 2018 International Convention, Artez Hardin was presented the International Mertious Service Award for actions while he was off-duty and shot an armed robber during the crime. He wasn't present

during the award ceremony, but shown here, IL 13 President Kenny Hahs presented Artez with his award.

Below is recall of what took place:

A man who attempted to rob a Shell gas station in St. Louis was fatally shot by an off-duty officer, police said. The shooting is the fourth fatal one involving St. Louis police in the last five weeks. Authorities identified the would-be robber in Tuesday night's shootout as Chazz Brown, 33. Between 2006 and 2009, Brown pleaded guilty to numerous charges, including felony theft, second-degree robbery, armed criminal action, stealing a motor vehicle and third degree assault.

Interim Police Chief Lawrence O'Toole briefed reporters early the next day at the Shell gas station. "The officer involved had just gotten off work and was inside the store with two clerks and another customer at about 11:40 p.m.", O'Toole said. "That's when Brown walked in, pulled out a gun and demanded money. The officer, who was in street clothes, identified himself before Brown turned toward the officer and began shooting. The officer fired back."

"Brown was pronounced dead at the scene. A handgun believed to have been used by him was recovered. No one other than Brown was injured", O'Toole said. "The officer who shot him is a seven-vear veteran of the force... the clerks, other witnesses and video evidence from the scene corroborated the officer's version of events." A witness told the Post-Dispatch Newspaper he was pumping gas when he heard gunfire inside the gas station and dropped to the ground. He said he saw an officer near the front door who was pointing a gun toward the restrooms in the station. Just after the gunfire, the witness said, several officers converged on the gas station. Police quickly cordoned off the site.

The business hosts a police substation and people at the scene said there are usually police officers there. They use the substation to write reports and make calls.




t was a sad day in central Florida as many Blue Knights rode to the funeral service for Brevard County Deputy Sheriff Kevin Stanton. Deputy Stanton was killed while on duty one Saturday morning. He was killed when his patrol car was struck by a tractor-trailer on I-95

Kim Roberts, wife to Aaron Roberts, was there to receive the check along with their daughter, Lydia. She says the community support has been amazing. "It's been


overwhelming just walking through a tragedy like this, with a seven-year-old," Kim Roberts said. "It's not been easy. But we've had lots of support."

# Chaplain's Corner

#### **Greetings Fellow Blue Knights...**

What an honor it is to serve the men and women of the Blue Knights Law Enforcement Motorcycle Club as your International Chaplain.

I would like to first begin by sharing my law enforcement career with you which started in 1979 when I enlisted in the Air National Guard as a Security (Police) Forces member. I retired in 2003 after serving 24 years with numerous call-ups and deployments around the world. My civilian law enforcement career began in 1987 when I was sworn in as a police officer with the Terre Haute Police Department. I served with them until retiring in 2012. My retirement from law enforcement was short lived as God's plan continued to be revealed. I returned to active service as a Town Marshal in a small community and also started working as a School Protection Officer in a middle school protecting children.

My calling to the ministry came in 1998 at which time I began my studies at a Global University/Berean School of the Bible study center at my home church. Upon completion of my studies I applied for my credentialing with the Assemblies of God and became an Ordained Minister. I also received my endorsement as an Emergency Services Chaplain with the Assemblies of God and became a Master Chaplain with the







International Conference of Police Chaplains. I now serve in many communities including the Federal Prison where I established a Global University Study Center teaching inmates using the Berean School of the Bible courses. As a chaplain and have witnessed God moving powerfully in the lives of those in law enforcement and those in our prisons.

The one day I will never forget that change my life and the ministry forever was on July 11th 2011. I had received the worse call a chaplain could receive. I was notified that a Terre Haute Police officer had been shot while assisting the US Marshal's Fugitive Task Force while serving a warrant. I will never forget seeing the Special Response Team carrying the policemen's body from the house that he was shot at and laying him on the ground outside shouting "hold on Brent." We all were praying

and worked desperately to save his life, however he succumbed to the gunshot wounds. In the end this young man's mother

said something to me that changed my outlook and the way I perform as a chaplain. His mother said it was a "great comfort" to her knowing that there was a chaplain there to pray for her son's eternal soul and to ask for God's mercy when all else had failed. As a police officer and chaplain, I deal with or hear about life and death seemingly every day. I want to see God's promises applied to all those in law enforcement who are on the frontlines of spiritual darkness protecting us.

After the tragic death of Brent, his many friends started a motorcycle ride to honor his memory naming the ride after Brent's nickname "Bean." Of course as police we added the name "Pork" to it now calling it the "Pork & Bean." The ride was organized and in 2012 a group of law enforcement motorcycle riders calling themselves the Blue Knights rode with us in honor of Brent's memory. It wasn't long after that I made acquaintance with these Blue Knights. They mentioned to me of their need for a law enforcement chaplain for their local chapter and would I be interested. Being already over-committed and after several heart to heart talks with God, I joined Indiana X to serve as their chaplain. Not long afterwards, I was selected to serve as the Great Lakes Regional Conference Chaplain.

The ministries we were called into were a direct result of an outpouring of the Holy Spirit at my home church (Cross Tabernacle,) and with any move of God, ministry is birthed and we were called out to serve the mission fields of American. I remember during this time as I prepared to become a missionary chaplain, God impressed upon me the scripture from 1 Chronicles 4:10, which called the prayer of Jabez.

<sup>10</sup> And Jabez called on the God of Israel saying, "Oh, that You would bless me indeed, and enlarge my territory, that Your hand would be with me, and that You would keep me from evil, that I may not cause pain!" So God granted him what he requested.

Little did I know the effects that this prayer would have on the ministries that God called us to do. While attending the Blue Knights International Convention at Stone Mountain Georgia, God had expanded us from one Blue Knights chapter to serve for all Blue Knights as I was appointed to serve as the International Chaplain.

My wife Felicia is also a credential minister with the Assemblies of God and a foreign language teacher. Felicia helps organize ministry events and works directly with the police wives ladies auxiliary. Felicia also chairs a police wives Bible study group to bring a deeper understanding to God's word. Felicia and I are so honored to see and be a part of the move of God moving throughout the Blue Knights and around the world witnessing God and seeing lives changed and saved for eternity.




