Greetings fellow Blue Knights,

On January 11<sup>th</sup> the criminal matter with our former Office Manager, Bessie Small, was concluded and she was sentenced to 12 months in prison, with 3 years' probation upon her release. She was also ordered to pay restitution as well. Although

this is not what I, and many of you wanted, it was the best offer we could get without reducing her time lower, which we fought against. On February 10<sup>th</sup>, Bessie checked in to the Penobscot County Jail to begin her 12-month sentence. The following week she was transferred to the Maine Department of Corrections.

Although the criminal proceedings have concluded, we still have 2 civil suits pending against her, and family members. I've asked members not to discuss this on social media and though many have complied there are a few that just don't get it unfortunately. Negative comments can adversely affect the cases since the judge that presided over the criminal case is also assigned to the civil cases. Now that the criminal proceedings have concluded, the civil cases will now proceed.

On a positive note, earlier last year, SRC Int'I Rep Bob Awtrey submitted proposal 2018-0004, a bylaw change that would allow for electronic voting should the day come. It passed overwhelmingly with the International Board of Directors, and at the General Membership meeting at Stone Mountain, Georgia. Well I am proud to say that time may be here sooner, rather than later.

This past winter, SRC Int'l Rep Bob Awtrey, who chairs the Election Committee appointed by me, traveled to Bangor, Maine in October to meet with Maine State Senator Geoff Gratwick who has sponsored a bill to allow for electronic voting in the state of Maine. I also met with Senator Gratwick as well during my office visit in December and am excited that bill number 894 for the 129th Maine Legislature has officially been submitted. The bill is being supported by several state senators, and representatives with no foreseeable objections. The bill is set to be signed sometime in March and will go into effect 60 days after the close of the session in June. After that it will be legal to vote electronically in the state of Maine, which not only benefits the Blue Knights<sup>®</sup>, but every non-profit as well.

In the interim, the Election Committee will work to submit any necessary bylaw changes needed for the next Board of Directors meeting so that it can be ratified at the General Membership meeting in Rye, New York in August. Once this is done electronic voting can be done at every level within the organization, and the cost savings alone for the International elections would be estimated in the \$20,000 range. This is something that has been a long time coming, and I wanted it done under my leadership. Bob Awtrey, and his committee have done an outstanding job, and working with Bob on this has been a pleasure for me and seeing it play out is even better. I've also spoken with the BOG Chairman about possibly having the 2020 BOG election done electronically as a test to see how it works and to eliminate any issues with the process. If this is done, it would clear the way to have the 2021 International Executive Committee elections in 2021.

Finally, another thing you'll see this year is the decal for the members who've renewed their membership for 2019. This was something I started as International Vice President, and it's been a couple of years since we gave them out due to budgetary reasons. In November, when we were approving this year's budget, I requested the funds to make this happen. It was approved, so they'll be going out sometime in March to the chapter addresses to pass out to the members.

Well, 2018 is over; and financially speaking we have good news. We closed the year in the black for the second consecutive year. Again, this was accomplished by coming up with a budget and sticking to it as well as a lot of belt tightening. Some of the budget

cuts made in 2018 will be partially restored in the 2019 budget. The 2019 budget is available in the member's only area of the Int'l Website.

As we move into 2019, U.S. Chapter Treasurers need to remember to file the form 990. You can file electronically (990-N) if you have \$50,000 or less in annual receipts. For those that cannot file electronically, you must do the regular form 990. The due date for filing is May 15th. If you fail to file for three consecutive years, your chapter will lose their tax-exempt status with the IRS.

For chapters outside the U.S., please do not forget to check with your local tax office to see what filings you need to do. If there is anything you need from the Int'I to meet your tax requirements, please include me in any emails to the Int'I Office. I will do my best to help you get what you need.

# **BK Brotherhood Knows No Bounds** Nor Borders

Though I reside in Colorado, one of my motorcycles resides in Germany. This story begins in July of 2018 where I was motorcycling from Germany to the city of Odessa in the Ukraine. I was traveling with a group of about forty other Blue Knights members from Germany, Austria, a couple of Americans and a Belgian for good measure. We were met and welcomed several times by Romania II, III and IV members. We traveled from the Czech Republic through the countries of Slovakia, Hungary, Serbia, Bulgaria and the Ukraine. The roads got progressively worse until we were riding on dirt treks next to the dilapidated pavement of a bygone era. However, we finally reached the city of Mamaia, Romania where we lounged in the soothing waters of the Black Sea.

In the evening we were welcomed by members of the Romania III and presented with inscribed lanyards to commemorate our visit. Several days later they journeyed several hours to visit with us again, in Galati, Romania, this time bringing homemade bottles of Slivovitz. They advised us they had arranged for some friends in the country of Moldova to provide us with a tour of the area. They also arranged for an "express entry" when we returned to Romania after visiting Ukraine and Moldova.

In Moldova we were welcomed by a group of motorcycle riders who took us on a spectacular day's ride of the countryside; touring the Epoca De Piatra subterranean restaurant/hotel. There we had lunch in the ancient town of Villa Etnika, toured the Orhei Vechi Monestary, visited the Crikova Winery, and finally rode through a corn field to beautiful spot overlooking the Raut River. As we all sat in the grass and enjoyed the view, the camaraderie and the laughs, our guides produced a few bottles of champagne and plastic cups.

The following day, heading to the Romanian border, I was delayed at a gas station and got separated from the main group. As my friend and I reached the Romanian border, we saw an officer at the back of two long lines of vehicles, waiving us to unused border inspection station. An officer came out, collected



our documents and knowing I was from the U.S., he smilingly addressed me in English and named off my country's last five Presidents. He



then stamped our passports and wished us a safe trip. This was amazing as it took between 1.5 - 3 hours to cross into the Ukraine!

In Vaslui, Romania we rejoined our group at the city square where the mayor's office had set up a couple of tents to shelter us from the drizzling rain stocked with hot coffee,

tea, and bottled water. 15 -20 police officers were in attendance for photos and to safeguard our motorcycles. The mayor's representative welcomed us to the city and requested we return when we had more time to stay. Afterwards they took us for a



stroll to the Royal Church of Stephen the Great, which dates to 1490. The entire way we were photographed and videotaped for the local media! I felt like I was in a group of elected officials with such pomp and circumstance! At the church and park, we were given a private tour and description of the Chapel, commemorating the beheading of Saint John the Baptist. We then received a police escort at break neck speeds, lights flashing and sirens screaming to Chisnau Botanical Garden where we went for a stroll while a uniformed officer watched our bikes. The full-service garden restaurant contained within, was waiting for our group. We had a wonderful meal, to include a large birthday cake, for one of our members. A GREAT time was had by all and, after the meal, we bid our hosts a fond farewell.

I am reliving this story here to show that the brotherhood does extend beyond our borders. Traveling in Europe with such a diversity of languages, many professionals also speak English. I have never felt alone or alienated when visiting with colleagues. No one ever cares what your position or your pay level is, just your membership in "The Club".

In many countries the International Police Association is the only organization permitted to Police Officers. Identifying myself to a supervisor at the Odessa, Ukraine police station, I asked to trade for a police patch. He brought out patches from the City of Odessa, and their country's National Patch. After they took photos of me with their officer, they were amazed when I offered the American patch that I'd started with. They didn't understand that I was giving it to them. So, there is a very accommodating culture in Europe, I recommend the travel. I don't know if the Romanian Officers are member of the International Police Association, but they are brothers. I don't have words to describe my gratitude at the welcome that they provided. By the way, my group will be returning to Vaslui, Romania in 2021.

I would like to acknowledge and to thank some of the members of the law enforcement community in the country of Romania for the camaraderie and brotherhood they demonstrated.

# Blue Knights Donate Toys to Foster Kids

The Blue Knights GA XVIII presented hundreds of toys to Troup County Court Appointed Special Advocates for Children (CASA) to be given out to local foster children this Christmas season (CASA is their primary charity). CASA is a non-government nonprofit agency that advocates for the best interest of Troup and Heard counties' abused and neglected children.

The toys were purchased by GA XVIII with a little help from L&L Motorsports who donated a 50cc scooter GA XVIII raffled off to raise funds to buy toys for the foster kids. The local branch of CASA oversees more than 215 foster children in Troup-Heard County area. While not exactly needy, foster families often don't have extra money during the holidays. Fortunately, the GA XVIII Blue Knights are there to lend a hand and open their wallets. Many of the raffle tickets were bought by club members themselves. CASA will distribute the toys to the foster families that they oversee so that the kids have something under the Christmas tree. 
